Last month was **National Bullying Awareness Month** and I was able to get into most of the classrooms and talk to the students about Bullying. Here is what they learned:

- 1. Bullying is repeated, unwanted aggressive behavior towards someone. Someone is being hurt on purpose; it can be physical, verbal, or cyber.
- 2. Mean Behavior is a one time thing and is a reaction to a strong emotion or feeling. It happens once and doesn't repeat itself.
- 3. Students learned the different types of bullying.
- 4. Students learned how to protect themselves and how to help others.
- 5. Students learned when and how to report bullying.

Students who exhibit the 3R's, great behavior, and a strong work ethic will continue to earn House Points. We are looking for perfect attendance, respect, responsibility and readiness daily. We want to focus on the positive attributes of students. We know many of our students come to school Rosa Ready every day and we salute them.





Attendance:

Did you know that students in elementary schools with too many absences can cause children to fall behind in their academics? Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read. Students can still fall behind if they miss just 1 or 2 days every few weeks. Being late to school may lead to poor attendance and can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Eventually good attendance will be a skill that will help them succeed in high school and college.

Please make sure your child(ren) are ready for school with a good breakfast to start their day.

Student Rewards:

Students have an opportunity to receive a "Caught Being Good Ticket" from any adult in the building. At the end of the school day, they come to my office to receive an incentive.
